Stanislav Petrovich Merkuriev, rector of St.Petersburg State University (1985-1993), full member of Russian Academy of Sciences, untimely died in 1993 at the age of 47 and at the peak of his scientific, pedagogical and administrative activity. He left a valuable heritage of pioneering ideas and results in quantum few-body theory and other fields of mathematical and computational physics. He played a key role in reformation and preserving the high level of education at St.Petersburg State University during a hard period of political changes in Russia. He organized the first Department of Computational Physics in Russia and headed it from 1985 to 1993.

This workshop is intended to pay tribute to his memory and to present the modern state of art of computational physics.
